

Film Nation: Shorts Film Director Masterclass with Luke Snellin

Film Nation: Shorts is a competition that invites young people (aged 14-25) to make, and vote for, films celebrating the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Run in partnership with Panasonic, Film Nation: Shorts will introduce young people to film-making, support them in developing their talent, and give everyone who enters a chance to have their work screened around the UK. Winning films will be screened in front of the crowds in venues during the Olympic and Paralympic Games in London in 2012.



The competition is accompanied by a UK-wide programme of workshops to provide extra help to young people to begin making films, develop their skills and meet other people to share ideas and develop projects.

BAFTA nominated and Virgin Media Shorts winning director Luke Snellin (dir. Mixtape, Disco) will be sharing his directional secrets in this special masterclass. We will be talking to Luke about the production processes and inspirations behind his work. An audience Q&A will follow.

Luke Snellin has written and directed several short films, commercials and music videos. His short film Mixtape was nominated for a BAFTA in 2010 and won The Grand Prize in the Virgin Media Shorts Competition. Most recently Luke has completed music videos for Cloud Control and has directed the Old Vic New Voices' first ever 24 Hour Short Film which was exec produced by Kevin Spacey. Earlier in the year he completed a short film made for the launch of VMS 2011 entitled Charlie. He is currently writing the screenplay for his debut feature film The Wanderers.
